

Root coverage in class III Miller's recession using subepithelial conjunctive graft

Abstract

Currently, the demand for periodontal plastic surgery has increased significantly, especially in cases of hypersensitivity and aesthetic discomfort as unfavorable for root exposure. The etiology is multifactorial, and several techniques are used for root coverage. In the case presented, the recession was classified as Miller's class III and the proposed treatment was the root coverage with subepithelial connective tissue graft, promoting gain of keratinized tissue and root coverage, improving the aesthetics of a fixed prosthesis of molten metallic core and crown PFM.
